There being a quorum present sufficient to transact the business of the City, the following proceedings were had and done.

There were no public hearings to be heard at this time.

The Mayor opened the floor for public comments and no one came forward to be heard.

In an effort to complete the remaining paving work in the Gateway project area, the contractor asks for compensation for labor, materials, and equipment, and supervision as required to demolish and haul off remaining existing asphalt parking lot, cut and fine grade existing subgrade, and pave with 3.5" of asphalt (2" binder & 1.5" surface), modify scope asphalt to 3.5", and stripe parking lot with white 4" thermoplastic striping; add 2.5" of crushed concrete to the south parking area.

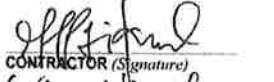

Subject: Potential change order for remaining paving work on the Gateway Phase II project

Overview:

This memo provides an update on the remaining paving work in the Gateway project area and outlines the funding considerations needed for the upcoming change order. As discussed at the most recent OAC meeting, Mayor Pierce requested that the proposed change order (PCO) for paving be presented to the Board at the December 16 meeting.

Current Funding Status:

Estimated Available Funds:

- Unallocated Dollars: \$92,742.64
- Owner's Contingency (remaining in Gnarly's contract): \$69,188.32
- Total Potential Available Funding: \$161,930.96

Gnarly's Quote for Remaining Parking Lot Paving: \$233,940.00

Funding Gap: \$72,009.04

Additional Pending Change Order:

- Flagpole lighting - \$3,082.61

Financial Considerations:

Given the current funding gap and the pending lighting change order, it's recommended that the Board consider retaining a portion of Gateway's contingency rather than fully depleting it. Maintaining a reasonable contingency balance will help ensure the project can absorb unforeseen needs as construction progresses.

- Road & Bridge Funds: \$100,000.00

This structure would retain approximately \$27,990.00 in contingency for future project requirements.

Next Steps:

- Prepare the draft paving change order early next week.
- Coordinate internally to finalize the numbers and confirm the recommended funding allocation.
- A completed PCO package will be submitted before the December 12 deadline for Board consideration at the December 16 meeting. Assuming this is an acceptable approach.

1. Add 2 ½" of limestone at the base bld asphalt locations (we're decreasing asphalt thickness from 6" to 3 ½")
2. At north parking lot (change order area), to accommodate the new 3 ½" asphalt:
 1. Remove existing 2" asphalt – you already priced this at \$23,328
 2. Remove, fine grade to drain and compact additional 1 ½" of subgrade – your CO price showed it was for +/-2". Would this CO price still be good for the 1 ½" we need to remove, or do you need to add to this? CO price should have been only for an additional 1" of cut, so I wasn't sure if this was a typo or not.

To Whom It May Concern,

Welcon Electrical Consultants would like to offer the following summary leading to decisions for design and light fixture selections for the Gateway Project at Long Beach Harbor.

While initial schematic design for the overall project started sooner, Welcon became engaged in this project in 2020 during the phase 1 design. Discussions began then for the electrical equipment as part of the project, especially lighting. Phase 1 was completely minimally for the electrical installations with only monument sign lighting and lighting for signage at the park entrances.

The design scheme all along was to create “features” and “landmarks” for the beachfront park area. These were to include simulated lighthouse, area lighting, pavilions, hardscape, and landscape features. For all of these installations, lighting was an integral part of the design.

The decision on lighting styles, function, and color goes back to phase 1 of the project. Mississippi Power Company (MPC) was engaged to upgrade the existing residential, lantern style poles owned by MPC and leased to the city. MPC offered some options for lighting installations and upgrades. The original proposal from MPC for all lighting was in the \$500K range with an adder of several thousand dollars a month for maintenance lease agreement. The project scope for phase 1 was cut back significantly. The site/area lights and the lighthouse feature were postponed and moved to phase 2 scope. The final for phase 1 became sign lights and up lights on different features. The pricing from MPC for the 15-20 ground mounted up-lights for phase 1 was still in the \$20K-\$30K range, with a few hundred dollars per month maintenance lease agreement. Additionally, at that time, MPC was not able to provide the color changing (RGB) lighting for the structure.

When phase 2 design started, MPC was not reengaged due to preliminary discussions and budget estimates provided during phase 1. Likewise, the complete lighting package could not be provided as part of the lease arrangement.

The decision was made based on upfront cost, long term cost associated with the lease, and availability of decorative and color change lights, the lighting package would be completely part of the bid packages and not part of the MPC lease.

Another note during the final approval process of phase 2 design, it was mandated by Wildlife and Fisheries that all lighting in the park be of amber color and “turtle friendly”. It was directed that all area lighting, landscape lighting on trees, and all general lighting at pavilions would be required amber color illumination. Various options were considered and reviewed to allow for color changing lights that could be amber during the required hatch season for the turtles and “white light” during other times of the year. These options proved to not be readily available. The light sources for the majority of the park will be amber color.

This is a summary to the best of my knowledge of the design decisions that were made and implemented for phase 1 and phase 2 of the park.

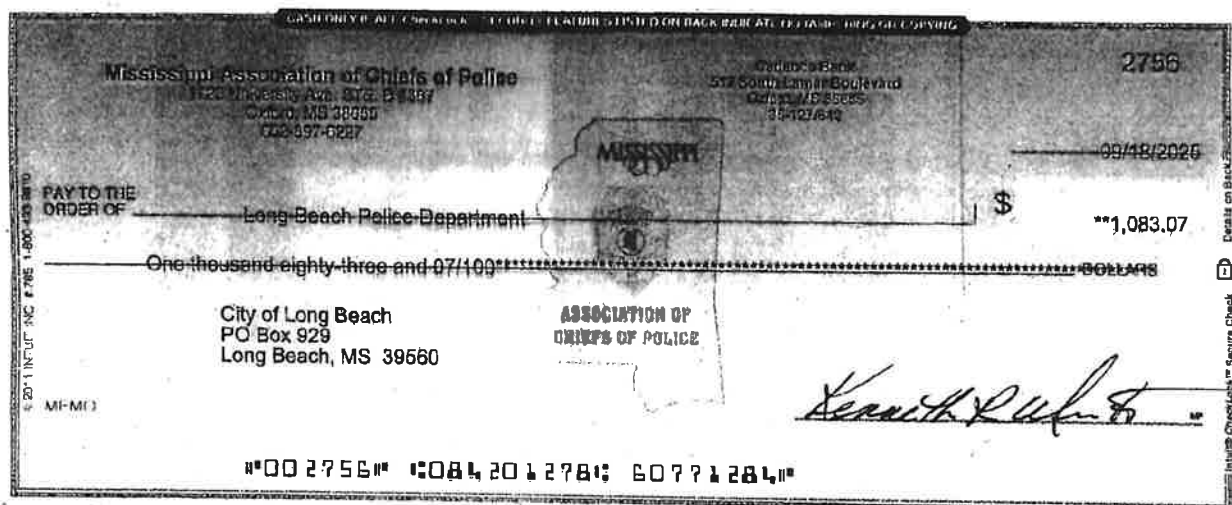

Ladies and Gentlemen:

In June 2023, Overstreet & Assoc. ("Overstreet") offered an estimated "not to exceed" amount for work necessary to complete the referenced project. That scope included the civil design, assistance to the City's prime consultant Christian Preus Landscape Architect, coordination of the bid process, some part time inspection along with limited construction administration in order to assist the consultant team throughout the project, along with other minor anticipated services.

Since then, the City has faced a number of obstacles to efficient completion of the project as detailed below:

- The City was required by the funding agency HUD to complete an extensive environmental review which took nearly a year to complete and which was performed by Larry Lewis with Overstreet assistance
- The City was required to enter into a modified Tidelands lease with the MS Secretary of State for improvements in a Tidelands area requiring preparation of significant documentation and maps to support the new Tidelands lease area
- The City was required to coordinate with the US Army Corps of Engineers Section 408 for improvements adjacent to the Harrison County Seawall
- Multiple times, the City has considered multiple options to complete a full overlay of the adjacent Harbor parking lot

In each of the above instances, Overstreet has been heavily involved in the work, either performing the work directly or in assistance to the consultant team. This additional, unforeseen work performed over the last 2-3 years has consumed our original "not to exceed" fee amount. We therefore request an amendment to our overall fee of \$26,000 to cover the amounts expended to-date and our estimate of work remaining to fully complete and closeout the project.

We do note that these costs are on a time & materials basis, meaning that the bills will be representative only of the actual hours of work performed on the tasks. Further, our total "not to exceed" fee for all work with this modification (including all the above unforeseen items) would be approximately \$96,500, just over 2.4% of the grant funds and eligible for reimbursement under the terms of that HUD grant.

Ladies and Gentlemen:

In June 2025, the City bid the referenced project, with the lowest bid offered by Twin L Construction, Inc. at a price of \$1,142,898.68. The project was to be funded by ARPA/MCWI via the MDEQ awarded project "425 – Critical Drainage Projects", which proposes drainage improvements to 3 areas in the City, including Park Row. However, the grant funding available at the time of award was insufficient to award the entire amount bid for the Park Row project. Therefore, we worked alongside Public Works and Twin L in order to determine the most effective & beneficial project scope that was near the City's available funds and ultimately recommended an award to Twin L at a "reduced scope" of \$638,589.45. In July 2025, the construction contract was awarded by the City to Twin L per that recommendation and since then we have worked toward commencing construction of that "reduced scope" contract. To date, no actual construction has begun, with only preparatory work begun, such as scheduling, submittal review, production of materials, etc.

However, in December 2025, MDEQ informed the City that the reduced scope award has been deemed ineligible for reimbursement due to violations of MS procurement law, namely that the negotiated scope represents a reduction in excess of the allowable threshold. Additionally, MDEQ has also determined that additional funds are available to fund the "425 - Critical Drainage Projects" grant, resolving the funding shortfall. This adjustment now enables the City to proceed with the full scope of work as originally bid.

As noted in Twin L's letter dated December 18, 2025, the contractor has agreed to honor its original bid price for the full scope of work if the City cancels the reduced-scope contract and re-awards the full project. Twin L has further indicated that no claims for damages due to contract cancellation will be pursued provided the full project is re-awarded promptly. Their offer to extend the original bid remains valid until February 28, 2026.

Given the legal compliance issue, the availability of sufficient funding, and the requirement to fully expend ARPA/MCWI grant funds by September 30, 2026, there is some urgency in addressing this matter. Therefore, it is our recommendation that the City rescind the current award and immediately re-award the contract to Twin L Construction, Inc. at their original bid amount of \$1,142,898.68 for the full scope of work. The full construction project can be completed prior to the legislative deadline if this award is made soon. Our recommendation is made for the City's consideration, subject to review and approval by the City Attorney.

Within the referenced project, there will be some protected tree removals required. This was anticipated and the contract was configured to require that scope of work and to provide a method of measurement and payment to the Contractor to perform removal when unavoidable. Quantities for this work were estimated and included in the construction contract, meaning that this does not represent an increase in the cost of the project. We encourage the Contractor to save all trees when possible, but we have encountered the first protected tree which must be removed: a 24" live oak in the yard of 718 Briarwood Dr. The tree is positioned so as to make the drainage improvements impossible without removal. There is no reasonable way to complete these critical improvements without removing this tree.
